When is it OK to NOT fulfill the Law?

Is it OK to steal to feed my family?

Is it OK to speed if I'm taking someone to the hospital?

Is it OK to smuggle Bibles into a communist country?

Is it OK to hide the Jews so the Nazi's can't find them?

God doesn't want rule-followers who put their confidence in their obedience!

He wants sons and daughters who put their confidence in Him!

### LUKE 6 (HCSB)

Lord of the Sabbath 1 On a Sabbath, He passed through the grainfields. His disciples were picking heads of grain, rubbing them in their hands, and eating them. 2 But some of the Pharisees said, "Why are <u>you</u> doing what is not lawful on the Sabbath?"

3 Jesus answered them, "Haven't you read what David and those who were with him did when he was hungry— 4 how he entered the house of God, and took and ate the sacred bread, which is not lawful for any but the priests to eat? <u>He even</u> <u>gave some to those who were with</u> <u>him."</u>

5 Then He told them, "The Son of Man is Lord of the Sabbath."

The Man with the Paralyzed Hand 6 <u>On another Sabbath</u> He entered the synagogue and was teaching. A man was there whose <u>right</u> hand was paralyzed.

7 The scribes and Pharisees were watching Him closely, to see if He would heal on the Sabbath, so that they could find a charge against Him. 8 But He knew their thoughts and told the man with the paralyzed hand, "Get up and stand here." So he got up and stood there. 9 Then Jesus said to them, "I ask you: Is it lawful on the Sabbath to do what is good or to do what is evil, to save life or to destroy it?" 10 After looking around at them all, He told him, "Stretch out your hand." He did so, and his hand was restored. 11 They, however, were filled with rage and started discussing with one another what they might do to Jesus.

### MATTHEW 12 (HCSB)

Lord of the Sabbath

1 At that time Jesus passed through the grainfields on the Sabbath. His disciples were hungry and began to pick and eat some heads of grain. 2 But when the Pharisees saw it, they said to Him, "Look, <u>Your</u> <u>disciples</u> are doing what is not lawful to do on the Sabbath!" 3 He said to them, "Haven't you read

what David did when he and those who were with him were hungry— 4 how he entered the house of God, and <u>they ate</u> the sacred bread, which is not lawful for him or for those with him to eat, but only for the priests?

5 Or haven't you read in the Law that on Sabbath days the priests in the temple violate the Sabbath and are innocent? 6 But I tell you that something greater than the temple is here! 7 If you had known what this means: I desire mercy and not sacrifice, you would not have condemned the innocent. 8 For the Son of Man is Lord of the Sabbath."

The Man with the Paralyzed Hand 9 Moving on from there, He entered their synagogue.

10 There He saw a man who had a paralyzed hand.

And in order to accuse Him <u>they</u> <u>asked Him, "Is it lawful to heal on</u> the Sabbath?"

11 But He said to them, "What man among you, if he had a sheep that fell into a pit on the Sabbath, wouldn't take hold of it and lift it out? 12 A man is worth far more than a sheep, so it is lawful to do what is good on the Sabbath." 13 Then He told the man, "Stretch out your hand." So he stretched it out, and it was restored, <u>as good as</u> the other. 14 But the Pharisees went out and plotted against Him, how they might destroy Him.

#### MARK 2 (HCSB)

Lord of the Sabbath 23 On the Sabbath He was going through the grainfields, and His disciples began to make their way picking some heads of grain. 24 The Pharisees said to Him, "Look, why are <u>they</u> doing what is not lawful on the Sabbath?"

25 He said to them, "Have you never read what David and those who were with him did when he was in need and hungry— 26 how he entered the house of God in the time of Abiathar the high priest and ate the sacred bread—which is not lawful for anyone to eat except the priests—<u>and also gave some to his</u> <u>companions?"</u>

27 Then He told them, "The Sabbath was made for man and not man for the Sabbath.

28 Therefore, the Son of Man is Lord even of the Sabbath."

## MARK 3

The Man with the Paralyzed Hand 1 Now He entered the synagogue again, and a man was there who had a paralyzed hand.

2 In order to accuse Him, they were watching Him closely to see whether He would heal him on the Sabbath. 3 He told the man with the paralyzed hand, "Stand before us."

4 Then He said to them, "Is it lawful on the Sabbath to do what is good or to do what is evil, to save life or to kill?" But they were silent. 5 After looking around at them <u>with anger</u> <u>and sorrow at the hardness of their</u> <u>hearts</u>, He told the man, "Stretch out your hand." So he stretched it out, and his hand was restored. 6 Immediately the Pharisees went out and started plotting <u>with the</u> <u>Herodians</u> against Him, how they might destroy Him.
